PRE-POLITICAL SCIENCE MAJOR – 2017-2018

Admission into the Political Science major is contingent upon successful completion of the requirements stipulated below. Students may declare a pre-Political Science major after they have completed at least <u>two</u> Political Science courses from the pre-major with at least a 2.6 UC grade-point average.

Once the pre-major is completed with a 2.6 UC GPA or higher, students may petition for admission into full major status. Admission to the pre-major does not guarantee admission to full major status.

To qualify for admission into full major status, students must complete Political Science 1, 6, 7, 12, and 15 with a UC grade-point average of 2.6 or above. In addition, students must complete Economics 1 and 2 (or 9) on a letter graded basis. Economics 1 and 2 (or 9) are excluded from the pre-major grade-point average computation but are included in the overall major GPA.

Transfer and upper-division students should consult the undergraduate advisor about course substitutions.
